



PETER THOMSON'S MERCEDES BENZ 230SLK COMPRESSOR 1996 MODEL REPAIR

I've had it a few years and it is a great car to drive. Fifteen months ago the top would come down but wouldn't go back up. The hydraulics had stopped working. I took the car to my mechanic who was able to get the top back up, and, on making enquiries found that there were no parts available.

I started making enquiries at the various hydraulic specialists in Australia, but no one was prepared to overhaul the hydraulics. My mechanic was also checking and found a person who was overhauling hydraulics for Jaguars. After speaking to him he gave me the name of an American Co. who was servicing these cylinders. I ordered them and after 6 weeks they arrived. My mechanic offered to replace them in my car..so I gave them to him and he started disassembling the car. Unfortunately, the mechanic was involved in a head on accident and was advised never to work on cars again! His workshop told me they couldn't repair my car and I took it home in a disassembled condition. It stayed in my garage for quite a few weeks.

I spoke to another mechanic in Woolgoolga and he told me that they refer their Mercedes work to two different workshops in Coffs. The first was not interested in the work, but the second one agreed to look at the car. I had it towed to his workshop. They kept the car for a week, then told me they couldn't fix it because it was so pulled apart. I managed to drive the car back home.

I told Ken Stanley, Neville Hoy, Dennis Thomas, Terry Nutland, Albert Johnson and Steve Woods whom I meet on Tuesdays at Woolgoolga for lunch what had happened and asked if they could tell me what to do. We arranged a day for them to come to my house and assess the condition. I had by this time sorted out most of the trim from the boot and passenger area, the trim, bolts, and screws into various sections. The first day they came over, they worked on the front seat trims and seat belts which had been disassembled by the mechanic. Ken and Neville then worked on the boot trying to work out where all the screws, brackets and clips went. We found the Rams for the boot lid were disconnected. After reconnecting the boot Rams and trying to operate the roof mechanism, we found that one of the Rams was leaking. At this point we decided to stop as I had to find some new Rams.

After a few phone calls around the country I was told by a Mercedes wrecker in Melbourne to try a sun roof installer there. He gave me their name and phone number. I spoke to them and found out that they do repairs on hydraulic hard top convertibles and had access to the Rams I needed. Two weeks later they sent me reconditioned Rams.

We all then met again, installed the new Rams, tidied up all the pipe work, but couldn't get the hydraulics to work! Steve checked all the relays in the car and found one that one didn't work. They got the hydraulic pump working and found that one of the boot Rams was going up instead of down so we couldn't shut the boot lid.

On the third day Ken, Dennis and I finally agreed that the hoses to the Rams were the wrong way around, so we swapped the two hoses on the pump and found that the boot lid would shut and all the windows worked correctly. We found that the numbers on the hoses on the Rams from Melbourne were back to front! All the Rams have numbers, one for each hose. We reattached the trims and now, finally, the car was repaired!

This was a difficult repair and, thanks to the combined experience of Ken, Dennis, Terry, Neville, Steve and Albert, who worked together enjoying the challenge of working it out.

I am very grateful for their help.






These changes are a Committee initiative to provide some options for members who are unable to attend evening meetings, particularly in the winter months.


Committee members meet for their Committee Meeting one hour prior to the General Meeting commencement time.

How to View the @cexcarclub Instagram Page (Easy: Without having a Instagram Account) Viewing the Instagram Page with a Web Browser (No Account Needed) Open Your Web Browser:

Click on the icon for your web browser (e.g., Chrome, Safari, Firefox) to open it.

In the address bar at the top, type www.instagram.com/cexcarclub/ and press Enter on your keyboard.
